

## Day Two, 2011 Super-Seniors World Teams Championships, Turkey

### AFTER TWO DAYS, ALL AUSSIE TEAMS REMAIN UNDEFEATED

Players and organizers awoke today to a fine day after overnight rain. The weather stayed fine throughout the day allowing all day two matches to be completed along with the matches not completed on day one.

The men's 60+ defeated South Africa 2-1 after Max Bates and Andrew Rae won the deciding doubles 2 and 1. Earlier Ray Bray lost his singles 4 and 1 but Andrew Rae levelled at a rubber each after Andrew won 2 and 1.

The men's 75+ had a tougher start against Turkey with Ray Woodforde down 1-4 in the third set to do 'a Doug Corbett' and fight his way back to a 6-4 win. Peter Froelich consolidated the teams position with a 6-0, 6-0 win. In the doubles Ray and Alan Hocking won 0 and 1.
